As We Gather – On the Mount of Transfiguration, Peter blurted out that it was good the disciples were there so they could build shelters for Jesus, Moses, and Elijah. Our being close to our Lord, though, is not good so that we might do something for Him; rather, it is good because we know He has done so much for us. Moses, the greatest prophet according to the reading from Deuteronomy, spoke God's Word, but Jesus is the Word, effecting our forgiveness and salvation in His sacrifice for us. His "departure," as Luke puts it in the Gospel, is literally His exodus, not from slavery in Egypt like Moses, but from sin and death through His sacrifice on the cross. Our Lord is the builder of His "house," the Church. Only because we have been forgiven is it good for us to be here, for as the psalm reminds us, "the Lord our God is holy!"

Old Testament Reading

¹Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho. And the LORD showed him all the land, Gilead as far as Dan, ²all Naphtali, the land of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the western sea, ³the Negeb, and the Plain, that is, the Valley of Jericho the city of palm trees, as far as Zoar. ⁴And the LORD said to him, "This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, 'I will give it to your offspring.' I have let you see it with your eyes, but you shall not go over there." ⁵So Moses the servant of the LORD died there in the land of Moab, according to the word of the LORD, ⁶and he buried him in the valley in the land of Moab opposite Beth-peor; but no one knows the place of his burial to this day. ⁷Moses was 120 years old when he died. His eye was undimmed, and his vigor unabated. ⁸And the people of Israel wept for Moses in the plains of Moab thirty days. Then the days of weeping and mourning for Moses were ended.

⁹And Joshua the son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, for Moses had laid his hands on him. So the people of Israel obeyed him and did as the LORD had commanded Moses. ¹⁰And there has not arisen a prophet since in Israel like Moses, whom the LORD knew face to face, ¹¹none like him for all the signs and the wonders that the LORD sent him to do in the land of Egypt, to Pharaoh and to all his servants and to all his land, ¹²and for all the mighty power and all the great deeds of terror that Moses did in the sight of all Israel.

And we are his house if indeed we hold fast our confidence and our boasting in our hope.

Luke 9:28–36

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the fourth chapter.

Glory to You, O Lord.

²⁸Now about eight days after these sayings [Jesus] took with him Peter and John and James and went up on the mountain to pray.

²⁹And as he was praying, the appearance of his face was altered, and his clothing became dazzling white. ³⁰And behold, two men were talking with him, Moses and Elijah, ³¹who appeared in glory and spoke of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. ³²Now Peter and those who were with him were heavy with sleep, but when they became fully awake they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. ³³And as the men were parting from him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah"—not knowing what he said. ³⁴As he was saying these things, a cloud came and overshadowed them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. ³⁵And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, my Chosen One; listen to him!" ³⁶And when the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and told no one in those days anything of what they had seen.

Sermon – "The Transfiguration of Jesus and What it Really Means!"

- 1. The Season of Epiphany focuses on how Jesus reveals Himself.
 - a. The Gospel lessons up until now reveal Jesus' power through what He did.
 - b. Transfiguration Sunday we focus on who Jesus really is, not with things He did, but simply by who He is, showing His divine glory.
- **2.** This historical moment of Jesus' transfiguration isn't just for us <u>to know</u> of His glory... along with these three disciples <u>we get a glimpse of the glory that awaits those Believers</u> who die in the true faith!
- **3.** Mountain top experiences are wonderful and can be life changing, but they aren't God's ultimate goal for us.
 - a. Like Peter, so many people focus on the wrong things as the most important things regarding faith and church-life.
 - b. So many disregard putting solid Biblical teaching and doctrine first and foremost, putting experiential feelings first instead of putting truth and solid doctrine first.
 - c. Exciting moments don't often last long... and actually can become the new humdrum norm.
 - d. Basing our relationship with God Almighty should not be based on feelings that can come and go.
- **4.** The ultimate meaning of the mountaintop experience of the Transfiguration is found in the experience on another mount... mount Calvary. It's only through understanding the ugly and vile shame of the cross can we then understand the meaning of the glory of Jesus' Transfiguration.
- **5.** The topic Jesus, Elijah and Moses spoke of was Jesus' departure (His "Exodus") that would take place in Jerusalem (His suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension)
- 6. Feelings, emotions, and excitement are part of who we are and our faith journey.
 - a. **<u>But</u>** we don't base our faith upon what we feel.
 - b. Our faith is based on and rooted in the historical reality of God in flesh loving us so much, and coming to us, suffering and dying for our sin, conquering death by rising from the grave.
- **7.** When our faith is somehow based on feelings and emotions, as we look for excitement, we fall into the deadly trap of us taking the reins and responsibility for part or even all of our faith... and miss or even reject what God the Holy Spirit is doing in our lives...
- **8.** Thank God for the staying-power of the cross. Thank God for the staying power in your baptism. These are things God alone has done.

Nicene Creed

 I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man: and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, whose kingdom will have no end. The three disciples on the mountain "were heavy with sleep." Surround people who are tired, poor, sick, or lonely with faith-filled medical personnel, friends, and family who seek to meet their needs. We pray especially for those near and dear to us. Use us as part of Your answers to their prayers, heavenly Father, to bring about strength, health, security, and companionship. Lord, in Your mercy,

hear our prayer.

- P Lord Jesus, You accompanied the disciples as they returned to the others. Be among Your Church as it gathers anywhere around Word and Sacrament. Bless Your Church and give Your people courage and opportunity to spread the news of Your death for our sins and Your resurrection on the third day for our salvation. Lord, in Your mercy,
- hear our prayer.

- Into Your gracious hands, heavenly Father, we commend ourselves and all for whom we pray, trusting in Your mercy for the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

- P Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My + → body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."
- In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My + → blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."



Farewell to Alleluia Luke 9:36

Luke writes that after the transfiguration, the three disciples "kept silent and told no one in those days anything of what they had seen." Because we know about our Lord's resurrection, we cannot keep silent, but during the season of Lent, which begins this Wednesday, we shall mute our liturgical praises and refrain from singing our alleluias until our Easter celebration. Let us sing our farewell to that song of gladness now.
