As We Gather – Too often we think about God's being up in His heaven, looking down on us. Today's Readings give us the correct perspective. Through Ezekiel, God announces that He is the One who will provide pasture for His people and that He will send them David to be their king. In the Psalm, we reflect that God is our maker. Christ is not only the first to rise from death, Paul explains in the Epistle; He is also the foremost, the One to subject all things under Him. And so His decisions when judging on the Last Day cannot be questioned. First and foremost, then, today is a day to let God's Word give us a correct perspective. This last Sunday of the Church Year is an opportunity to "make a joyful noise to Him with songs of praise" (Psalm 95:2).

- **O** We confess that we have wandered away as erring sheep, preferring the pleasures of this world rather than the rich pastures You have provided. Forgive us, O Lord.

- **We** confess that we have not always been loyal subjects of our Lord, but have made decisions based on our own thoughts and desires. Forgive us, O Lord.

- We confess that we have not always sought to share Your love and meet the needs of the people around us. We cannot change without Your grace, mercy, and strength. Forgive us, O Lord.
- P Rejoice! The One who comes to judge is the same Jesus who is the one who gave His body and shed His blood for you on the cross. He is the first to rise from death, and by His grace we shall follow Him to His eternal kingdom. As a called and ordained servant of Christ and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the +I Son and of the Holy Spirit.

⁴¹"Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. ⁴²For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, ⁴³I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not clothe me, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' ⁴⁴Then they also will answer, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not minister to you?' ⁴⁵Then he will answer them, saying, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' ⁴⁶And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

Sermon – "Your Take Home Final – Allowing Christ to be King and Lord of All"

- 1. Take Home Final Believers do have a take home final!
 - **a.** There can be no diving wall between how we are in every place and situation, including what we do for a living and <u>Whom we live to serve</u>.
 - **b.** If Jesus is not Lord <u>of All</u>, He is not Lord at all.
- **2.** Christ the King Sunday uses texts that demonstrate the Lordship of Christ... not the typical Lord and King of which the world thinks!
 - **a.** Jesus is the God of Great Reversals
 - **b.** He is the one person we encounter in our life who is hungry, who is thirsty, who is alone, who is alien, who is naked, who is sick, who is imprisoned... found in every fellow broken human we are to love.
- **3.** When Jesus finally judges all nations, it is *not* how obediently we stand in awe and worship of Christ the King that will determine our accountability before the throne... you know... like just showing up to church, <u>but</u> leaving Jesus there...
- **4.** Our "take home" exam answers are rooted in the Gospel that takes foothold in our souls... and it is based on Jesus' own mission statement given to Believers... and it flows from Jesus' own mission...
- **5.** Jesus turned His mission statement into our take-home final... but there <u>*IS*</u> a time limit known only to God.
 - **a.** When we fail, as we live in daily repentance, God meets us exactly where we are with His unconditional love, forgiveness, and mercy.
 - **b.** We are not the sum of all our failures. Let God have the final say!
- **6.** In the "Son of Man" judgment scenario, every action that we've done and do in our lives <u>Jesus takes personally.</u>
- **7.** As we bring Jesus with us into every situation from regular worship to our daily living, loving and serving all people as He commands, these are the times Christ is enthroned as King.

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread;


