

#### **Nicene Creed**





## Sermon – Sin, Like a Snakebite, is Overcome!

(Based on today's Old Testament, Epistle, and Gospel readings)

- A. Serpent problems from the Garden of Eden on!
  - **1.** God's first promise of the Messiah in Genesis 3:15.
  - 2. The snakes in the wilderness of Sinai were divine punishment.
    - a. The people were impatient and complaining.
    - **b.** We like the Israelites are quick to forget!
    - **c.** The Israelites finally saw their guilt and repented. Fear and hopelessness was used to bring them to repentance, and back to their only Provider and Deliverer they needed!
  - 3. God does judge sin harshly, but He delights in mercy more than judgment!
    - a. He faithfully keeps His promises.
    - **b.** Our God hears His people as they turn to Him and repent, providing the only and perfect remedy for whatever afflicts them!
      - **i.** God didn't provide someone that would crush the serpents' heads that were biting the people in the wilderness, but He gave them the remedy that removed the venom's power.
      - ii. So, in the midst of death, life was given!

- **4.** The Israelites faced a problem they created, and God provided the solution!
- **B.** The non-earthly type serpent problems that endanger our eternal lives, and the promised cure!
  - **1.** The deadly side-effects of evil and sin as we struggle with our old flesh, the venom of satan's lies and this world.
- **2.** This world outside the Church doesn't recognize the serpents, or the bites. They don't acknowledge the very real Spiritual Warfare that IS GOING ON! They are clueless or blind to the pain and suffering from the bites from the lies of the world and satan. And they don't really consider those as determining our home in eternity! This is a tragic and eternally deadly mistake.
  - **3.** Jesus identifies Himself as the One that is lifted up... the Only One by which salvation comes.
- **4.** Sin, like a snakebite, is overcome! It is finished. He has the last word forgiven as He took on your guilt. Your shame, guilt... your cuda-shuda-wudas are not your problem any more. When the accuser replays your past forgiven sins, turn to the cross, and yell at the devil that all those things were nailed to the cross, they are no longer on you! In Christ we live. Hallelujah and Amen!

#### **Confession and Absolution**

- P A short lesson on Confession and Absolution As we are asked to give and receive forgiveness, Jesus Himself gave authority to pastors to forgive the sins of those who repent, also. This is known as the "Office of the Keys." It is Jesus' forgiveness alone. He gives it privately between you and Him. He *also* gives forgiveness through the Office of Pastor that He instituted. It is only by His authority which He delegated. We find this in John chapter 20, "21 Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.' <sup>22</sup> And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld." So, when you hear the words of absolution, trust that you are forgiven, as if Jesus Himself said it, because He said so.
- Though Christ has loved us with this genuine love that gives us eternal life, we sometimes ignore His love and refuse to share Christ's love with others. Still, our heavenly Father is merciful, and He invites us to draw near to Him in hope and confidence to ask for His grace.

Silence for reflection.

- P Heavenly Father,
- we have sinned against You and against our neighbors. We have not loved You with our whole heart. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not loved our enemies. Forgive us, renew our love, on account of Jesus. Amen.
- P Jesus Christ was lifted up on the tree of the cross so that we might be forgiven. His genuine love is for the world and is for you. As a called and ordained servant of Christ and by *His* authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the +1 Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- Amen. We are forgiven by the genuine love of Jesus.

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
## **Post-Communion Thanksgiving**
