As We Gather – Both palms and passion are integral themes this day. Jesus comes into Jerusalem not for the crowds, but for the cross. He comes to suffer in our place and die our death that we might have life in Him. You cannot have the palms without the passion. We therefore join our voices in welcome to our King who comes humble and mounted on a donkey. Palms and hosannas will become suffering and death on the cross, where the only hope in life is born. Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

Holy Gospel

John 12:12–19

Psalm 118:19, 22, 26, 29

- The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the twelfth chapter. G Glory to You, O Lord.
- I¹²The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem.
 ¹³So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out,

G "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!"

P⁴And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written,

¹⁵"Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!"

¹⁶His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified *(after Jesus was crucified and raised from the dead)*, then they remembered that these things had been written about him and had been done to him. ¹⁷The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. ¹⁸The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. ¹⁹So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after him."

Confession and Absolution

- P Today is the beginning of Holy Week. During it we shall recall how our Savior gave His life so that our sins may all be forgiven, and heaven opened to us.
- **G** Even during worship, our minds wander to other concerns.
- These concerns are already known to God. Give them into His loving hands for resolution, but turn your hearts and minds to focus on our Lord's step-by-step determination to free us from every sin. Confident of the forgiveness He won through His glorious death and resurrection, let us then admit our sinful condition to Him and to one another.
- I confess to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have sinned in my thinking, speaking, and acting. I am mired in sin and incapable of saving myself. Heavenly Father, for Jesus' sake and because of His sacrifice for us fallen creatures, we beg You to forgive, strengthen, and turn us to Your will so that we may follow our Savior in loving service to You and to one another.
- As a called and ordained servant of Christ, who gave Himself over to death that we might have eternal life, and by His authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ++ Son and of the Holy Spirit.
 Amen.

Hosanna, Loud Hosanna



Sermon – "Take Heart. Sing Hosannas, Yes, Even Now." OUTLINE

- 1. Hosanna (from the Hebrew "hoshiah nah"), "Save now... or Save, I pray!"
- 2. The same sun that melts things and also bake clay and make it hard. Depending on the desires of people, God's truth can soften, or harden hearts.

- 3. What were the people wanting to be saved from? What do you cry out to God for?
- 4. The crosses we bear...
 - a. They are not our illnesses, struggles, and problems,
 - b. Our crosses we bear are our responses and attitudes in the midst of our illnesses, struggles and problems.
- 5. We often look for and pray for the wrong things... like the crowds on that 1st Palm Sunday, and people still miss, forget, or reject Him and His mission to bring His peace.
 - a. "Would that you, even you, had known on this day the things that make for peace!"
 - b. In a few days, on Good Friday, with Jesus' suffering and death, everyone, even the Jesus' followers, saw Him and His mission as a failure.
- 6. We know the rest of the story that the first Christians did not know then!
 - a. Jesus entered Jerusalem to bring and complete His Father's plan of salvation.
 - b. The only real peace that lasts and brings us everlasting life came when God Himself in Flesh, Holy, without sin, voluntarily suffered and died in our place.
- 7. When we shout and sing hosanna, and cry out to the Jesus to save us, does it ring just as hollow as all those people then? Do we shout hosanna for the wrong reasons?
- 8. The cross, His Word preached, taught, and read, and His sacraments are our joy and peace.
 - a. Do we really believe this and practice it? Do you take Jesus at His Word?
 - b. Where Jesus, the Prince of Peace, promises to be, that is where the peace that passes all understanding is!
 - c. Jesus has answered your Hosannas!

- Into Your hands, O Crucified King, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in Your steadfast love, which endures forever. Amen.



Words of Our Lord

- P Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My
 → body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."
- In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My +→ blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

Proclamation of Christ

- P As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.
- Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.
- P O Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, in giving us Your body and blood to eat and to drink, You lead us to remember and confess Your holy cross and passion, Your blessed death, Your rest in the tomb, Your resurrection from the dead, Your ascension into heaven, and Your coming for the final judgment. So remember us in Your kingdom and teach us to pray:

 - and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.


