

¹¹Remember that at one time you Gentiles in the flesh, called "the uncircumcision" by what is called the circumcision, which is made in the flesh by hands— ¹²remember that you were at that time separated from Christ, alienated from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. ¹³But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. ¹⁴For he himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility ¹⁵by abolishing the law of commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, ¹⁶and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility. ¹⁷And he came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near. ¹⁸For through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. ¹⁹So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, ²⁰built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, ²¹in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord. ²²In him you also are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit.

³⁰The apostles returned to Jesus and told him all that they had done and taught. ³¹And he said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a desolate place and rest a while." For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. ³²And they went away in the boat to a desolate place by themselves. ³³Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they ran there on foot from all the towns and got there ahead of them. ³⁴When he went ashore he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. And he began to teach them many things. ³⁵And when it grew late, his disciples came to him and said, "This is a desolate place, and the hour is now late. ³⁶Send them away to go into the surrounding countryside and villages and buy themselves something to eat." ³⁷But he answered them, "You give them something to eat." And they said to him, "Shall we go and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread and give it to them to eat?" 38And he said to them, "How many loaves do you have? Go and see." And when they had found out, they said, "Five, and two fish." ³⁹Then he commanded them all to sit down in groups on the green grass. ⁴⁰So they sat down in groups, by hundreds and by fifties. 41 And taking the five loaves and the two fish he looked up to heaven and said a blessing and broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples to set before the people. And he divided the two fish among them all. ⁴²And they all ate and were satisfied. ⁴³And they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish. ⁴⁴And those who ate the loaves were five thousand men.

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SERMON - "Jesus Destroyed Unhealthy Walls - In Him We Unite"

Theme: Walls – Some walls can be good and necessary (physically and figuratively). Some Christians have unhealthy walls, even in church. Jesus is able to tear down unhealthy walls that separate. Christians should detest unhealthy walls, for in Christ, He builds us into a temple.

- "Now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For He Himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in His flesh the dividing wall of hostility."
 - In other words, sin was a "wall of hostility" between man and God which was impossible for man to surmount.
 - That ultimate wall was torn down by Jesus on the cross.
 - Although the ultimate wall is torn down by Jesus, sinful unrepentance, and lack of trust in Him keeps a "man-made wall of hostility" up... even in the church!
- 2. Man-made "walls of hostility" then and now.
 - a. Then a wall of hostility put up by Christian Jews who told Gentiles that in order to become Christian non-Jews had to convert to be a Jew first (a false teaching). New non-Jewish Christians were treated like 2nd class Christians.

- b. Now cliques in churches can make people feel a wall is up. People who serve, who don't reach out to others to come alongside them can come across as territorial, making people feel a wall is up! WHEREVER THIS IS GOING ON, THIS NEEDS TO STOP!
- 3. Although these things happen, Believers have never been excluded from citizenship in God's Kingdom, i.e. they've never been considered "strangers to the covenants of promise."
 - a. The old wall included Jewish traditions, beliefs, and laws that kept them separated for a time until the Messiah came.
 - b. When Messiah came, His purpose for God's Chosen People was fulfilled done. The temple (which pointed to Jesus) fulfilled its purpose no more sacrifices needed. The Holy Spirit is available to all Believers. Look at Ephesians 2:15-20
 - c. Jesus made two groups into one group the Human Temple. We do not believe in "Replacement Theology." This is Fulfilled/Completed Theology The Abrahamic Covenant and everything that the Temple pointed to has been fulfilled by Jesus the Messiah.
- 4. Today within the church people still are prone to building unhealthy walls. Sin does this. Friends, unity is not based on common fears. Unity is not based on people who look like us. Unity should not be based on the same old members serving. Unity is not based on congregational voters' meetings. These types of things build walls where they shouldn't be. No. Peace, unity, harmony, and security is not found in building or maintaining walls based on these things. In Jesus is our peace and unity. We don't need a vote for that. He is the cornerstone, His apostles, prophets and our confession of faith is the foundation not for a wall, but for the temple we believers are all to be! We need to get love right, right here, so we can give it out there!
- 5. Friends, unity is not based on common fears. Unity is not based on people who look like us. Unity should not be based on the same old members serving who chose not to reach out to others to come alongside them. Unity is not based on congregational voters' meetings. These types of things build walls where they shouldn't be. No. Peace, unity, harmony, and security is not found in building or maintaining walls based on these things. In Jesus is our peace and unity. We don't need a vote for that. He is the cornerstone, His apostles, prophets and our confession of faith is the foundation not for a wall, but for the temple we believers are all to be! We need to get love right, right here, so we can give it out there!
- 6. Humility and repentance is at the core of keeping the walls down that Jesus has torn down and does not want up. Jesus is the answer to all these issues. We need to turn to Him, repent, and receive forgiveness and healing, because in Him we find renewal, our unity and the solutions for our problems.

- 7. St. Paul urges believer to be "eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." He's not saying to eliminate differences between people Equality does not mean "same-ness." Differences can be celebrated... different cultures, skin colours, social and economic status, strengths, being male or female, etc. Paul isn't saying just try to be better at getting along with each other. We are to subject all differences to God's Word... ultimately to Jesus... because if certain differences really don't matter to Jesus, why should they matter to us believers!
- 8. Believing = Be Living In. Belief isn't a passive thing that happens in the mind. The Holy Spirit empowers us to blow past walls that create fake and unhealthy division and enables us to believe and live out our beliefs.
