As We Gather – Thanksgiving means overeating for many Americans, but all that food isn't good for us. Moreover, the adage is still true: "You are what you eat." Our preoccupation with what is in front of our eyes clouds the food we truly need—the soul food, our Lord Himself. He comes to us whenever and wherever the Word is proclaimed; indeed, He is the Word in the flesh. When we find nourishment from Him, every part of our life is strengthened. Only with His Spirit within us are we able to think on whatever is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, commendable, excellent, and worthy of praise, as Paul exhorts in the Epistle. Being fed by the Word, our Lord Jesus Christ, is cause for thanksgiving every time we receive Him aurally in the proclaimed Gospel and orally in the Eucharist.

- We confess that we have spoken lies, dishonored God's name, judged people on sight, adopted society's impure values, failed to tend to God's good creation, and forgotten to thank Him for providing all we need from day to day.
 - Heavenly Father, for the sake of Your Son, who did all things well and to whom alone belongs all the praise, we ask You to forgive what is past, graciously strengthen us for this day, and by Your indwelling Spirit move our feet to walk in ways pleasing to You.
- Paul was inspired to promise, "God will supply every need of yours according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus." Our heavenly Father does indeed supply your deepest need. In the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Thanks be to God.

¹⁴Yet it was kind of you to share my trouble. ¹⁵And you Philippians yourselves know that in the beginning of the gospel, when I left Macedonia, no church entered into partnership with me in giving and receiving, except you only. ¹⁶Even in Thessalonica you sent me help for my needs once and again. ¹⁷Not that I seek the gift, but I seek the fruit that increases to your credit. ¹⁸I have received full payment, and more. I am well supplied, having received from Epaphroditus the gifts you sent, a fragrant offering, a sacrifice acceptable and pleasing to God. ¹⁹And my God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus. ²⁰To our God and Father be glory forever and ever. Amen.

and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.




