As We Gather

Have you ever received a surprise present, one that was out of your own price range to get? That, in a nutshell, describes **Epiphany**. The Wise Men came to give presents, and instead received one their wealth could not have bought. We are included in this. We are baptized for the forgiveness of sins by His blood on the cross that covers our sins, once for all. That water and blood give us the greatest—and most expensive—gift in the world. Here we see Jesus revealed, manifested, in a star, in the coming of the Magi and the gifts they bring.

Invocation and Opening Sentences

Colossians 1:15-20

- **P** In the name of the Father and of the

 → Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- Amen.
- P He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation.

- For by Him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through Him and for Him.
- P And He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together.
- And He is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything He might be preeminent.
- P For in Him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell,
- and through Him to reconcile to Himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of His cross.



Confession and Absolution

- **P** Let us confess our sins to God our Father.
- Most merciful God, I confess that I am by nature sinful and unclean. I have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed.

- P Do you recognize the truth—that you have not loved God with your whole heart nor loved your neighbor as yourself?
- I confess that I have failed to keep the two great commandments by what I have done and what we have failed to do. Heavenly Father, I don't deserve Your forgiveness, but ask for it because of the greatest love shown at the cross.
- P Hear the great news: God has used two common earthly elements—water and blood—to forgive your sins and make you His very own. Through the cross of Christ and the blood of Jesus shed there, and because you have been baptized, you are forgiven of all of your sins, in the name of the Father and of the +1 Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- Thank You, Lord, for revealing Your mercy and grace to me on this great day of Epiphany.
- P Lord Jesus, thank You for shedding Your blood and giving us the waters of Holy Baptism,
- by which You sacrificed Your life for ours and made us a part of Your family forever. Amen.

- May He defend the cause of the poor of the people, give deliverance to the children of the needy, and crush the oppressor!
- L May they fear You while the sun endures, and as long as the moon, throughout all generations!
- May He be like rain that falls on the mown grass, like showers that water the earth!
- In His days may the righteous flourish, and peace abound, till the moon be no more!

Epistle Ephesians 3:1–12

¹For this reason I, Paul, a prisoner for Christ Jesus on behalf of you Gentiles— ²assuming that you have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for you, ³how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I have written briefly. ⁴When you read this, you can perceive my insight into the mystery of Christ, ⁵which was not made known to the sons of men in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit. ⁶This mystery is that the Gentiles are fellow heirs, members of the same body, and partakers of the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

⁷Of this gospel I was made a minister according to the gift of God's grace, which was given me by the working of his power. ⁸To me, though I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ, ⁹and to bring to light for everyone what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things, ¹⁰so that through the church the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. ¹¹This was according to the eternal purpose that he has realized in Christ Jesus our Lord, ¹²in whom we have boldness and access with confidence through our faith in him.

P Alleluia. Where is He who has been born king of the Jews?

For we saw His star when it rose and have come to worship Him. Alleluia.

Holy Gospel Matthew 2:1–12

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the second chapter. Glory to You, O Lord.

¹Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, ²saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." ³When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. ⁵They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet:

⁶"And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel."

⁷Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. ⁸And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him." ⁹After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. ¹¹And going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. ¹²And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.

- Use them to bring about blessing to those who are bringing justice and peace to our lands and to stop evildoers in their tracks.
- P We also remember those who are persecuted for Your name.
- For those who have to endure torture and persecution, give them the hope of their eternal reward.
- P Almighty God, You are the fountain of all wisdom. You know what we need before we ever ask, even when we do not know what to ask or even how to ask.
- We are but mortal men and women, but You are immortal, invisible, and wise. Look upon us with compassion, care for us, and meet our needs.
- These things we ask, almighty God, in Your name, trusting that in Your mercy and according to Your will, You will not only hear our prayers but answer them.
