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#### **Confession and Absolution**

- Let us make confession to our heavenly Father.

  With David, we can be confident that "the Lord hears when I call to Him."
- But we confess that we are not always that confident. When answers are delayed, we wonder if God is still listening.
- P With Jeremiah and Jesus, we know that we carry God's Word of judgment and grace with us.
- But we confess that we seldom have the prophet's courage, preferring to avoid confrontation and possible harm to ourselves.
- P With Paul, we would "stand firm . . . in the Lord," knowing that "our citizenship is in heaven."
- But we confess that at times the present moment looms larger than eternity, and we focus on earthly things.
- The Epistle promises that the One we await is "a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ." Let us therefore confidently go to God, asking His forgiveness for Jesus' sake.

Silence for reflection on the Word of God and for self-examination.

- P Almighty God, heavenly Father,
- we confess that we are by nature sinful. We have failed to love You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have reflected the society around us more than Your will for us in daily living. For the sake of Jesus Christ, Your Son and our Lord, forgive us, and by the power of Your Holy Spirit, cleanse our hearts and minds that we might walk in Your ways to the glory of Your holy name. Amen.
- P Christ Jesus, true man and true God, was obedient to His Father in all things and in our place. By His death, He destroyed death, and by His rising opened eternal life to all who call on Him for forgiveness. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. May God strengthen you in your Lenten journey toward the joys of Easter.

Jeremiah 26:8-15

- And when Jeremiah had finished speaking all that the Lord had commanded him to speak to all the people, then the priests and the prophets and all the people laid hold of him, saying,
- You shall die! Why have you prophesied in the name of the Lord, saying, "This house shall be like Shiloh, and this city shall be desolate, without inhabitant"?
- L And all the people gathered around Jeremiah in the house of the Lord. When the officials of Judah heard these things, they came up from the king's house to the house of the Lord and took their seat in the entry of the New Gate of the house of the Lord. Then the priests and the prophets said to the officials and to all the people,
- This man deserves the sentence of death, because he has prophesied against this city, as you have heard with your own ears.

- P Behold, your house is forsaken. And I tell you, you will not see Me until you say,
- Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!

Holy Gospel Luke 13:31–35

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the thirteenth chapter.
- G Glory to You, O Lord.
- P At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to [Jesus],
- **G** Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill You.

- P And He said to them, "Go and tell that fox, 'Behold, I cast out demons and perform cures today and tomorrow, and the third day I finish My course. Nevertheless, I must go on My way today and tomorrow and the day following, for it cannot be that a prophet should perish away from Jerusalem.' O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you would not! Behold, your house is forsaken. And I tell you, you will not see Me until you say,
- (Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!' "
- **P** This is the Gospel of the Lord.
- Praise to You, O Christ.

## Forsaken - A Choice, but Whose?

- **1.** Jesus regarded Jerusalem as forsaken because <u>they chose</u> to make themselves that way forsaken. They put themselves in that <u>condition</u>.
  - a. ἀφίημι (pronounced aphiaymi)... translated here as "forsaken"
  - b. These words of Jesus were not an eternal pronouncement of judgment and condemnation. It was their condition at that time.

#### 2. Aphiemi

- a. translated here as "forsaken" can also mean releasing something, loosing it, letting go... Jesus did mean here that God let them go...
- b. But aphiemi is used to describe some of Jesus' miracles (loosed a man's tongue that didn't work... loosed lame people's limbs...)
- c. Used to describe forgiveness of sins, i.e. forgiveness which releases/looses people from punishment, quilt, and shame.
- d. He wants us to "aphiemi" sin, to forsake sin instead of Him!
- **3.** From Creation onward, God consistently reached out in love offering forgiveness to Believers as they turned away from their rebellious sin. But, throughout time, people still rebel in prideful defiance... wanting to do things our way.
- **4.** In spite of the rejection and abuse, God reaches out for His rebellious, angry, unfaithful children... but, finally God had to release/loose His children to their desires. They chose to forsake Him. He's not a bully, and out of love He released them.
- **5.** There is a temptation for us to look down on these people, look back in time to these foolish Israelites who would forsake God time and time again... We are no different at times!
  - a. Some people have pushed God away, forsaken God, and choose to live in that forsaken state, but that is their choice. It is self-imposed forsakenness. But, the fires of hell are not yet their sentence, yet, because they are still alive. Thank God.
  - b. There are Christians who regularly worship but end up looking to and trusting in their own good works and service above really knowing God and His Word.
  - c. So often works-righteousness infects Christians, and it slaps Jesus in the face.
- **6.** Jesus spoke those tragic words of this forsaken condition, but they still were living and still had a chance to repent and trust in Him!
- **7.** God does not give up! While there is breath and pulse, there is a chance to repent.

## **Apostles' Creed**

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,

born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate,

was crucified, died and was buried.

He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead.

He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty.

From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church,

# **Prayer of the Church**

- P Let us pray for ourselves, the Church around the world, and all people in their various needs.
  - Heavenly Father, hear us as we pray for pastors and lay leaders near and far who, like Jeremiah, boldly proclaim Your Word in this fallen world.
- <u>MEN –</u> Give them courage to announce Your Word of judgment to trouble the complacent and Your Word of grace to comfort the distressed. Protect them from misguided court decisions and violent terrorists. Move the leaders of nations to work for compassionate and orderly societies and peaceful relations to their neighbor states.
- P Savior in heaven, hear us as we pray for those who, like David, call out to You in their distress. Listen to their cries for help.
- <u>WOMEN –</u> Give them patience and endurance in long-term illnesses, false imprisonments, stressful jobs, and vain accusations. Lift up the light of Your face upon them, O Lord. Grant them health and safety, justice and community, that they may be able to lie down and sleep in peace.
- P O Holy Spirit, hear us as we pray for all people who, like those in Paul's day, walk as enemies of the cross of Christ.
- Open their eyes to see that their end is destruction, that their god is their belly, and that their glory is their shame. Then, open their ears to hear the Gospel, that they may look heavenward instead of setting their minds on earthly things. May they join us when Christ returns in glory.
- P Compassionate God, hear us as we pray for caregivers, medical professionals, relief agencies, members of law enforcement, and the armed forces, and all who, like Jesus, are undeterred by opposition as they continue in their mission and ministry.
- May their love and devotion be reminders of Your grace offered to all. May their determination reflect Your sure promises. By their actions, may many be gathered under Your protecting arms of mercy.

- Into Your hands, heavenly Father, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in Your mercy for the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, who taught us to pray:
- Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name,

Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven;

give us this day our daily bread;

and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation,

but deliver us from evil.

For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.
